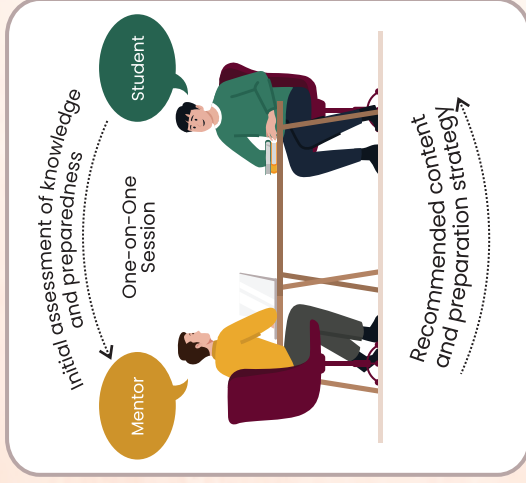
Beyond Mentorship Programme

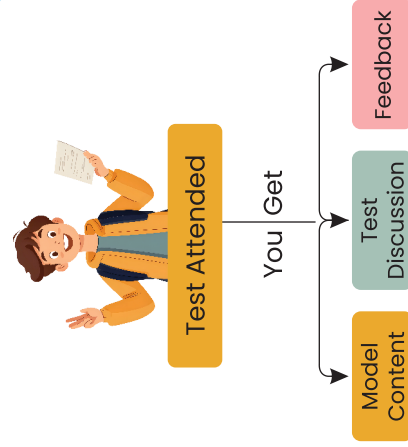

CHALLENGES FACED



Lack of a detailed timetable and scattered preparation

HOW DO WE SOLVE THE PROBLEM ?

Polity, History and Economy form a given module because they complement each other and there are natural interlinkages between topics)

No need to follow bulky newspapers unnecessarily. Manikant Sir will help declutter your current affairs preparation by providing a structure and giving you the essentials (from 6+ newspapers, journals and government sources)

This will give you actionable insights on how to judge your mock test performance. For example, it does not matter if you have 55 correct and 35 incorrect answers in a mock test. What matters is, are you able to apply intellectual guessing to solve the conceptual googly questions?; What is your accuracy rate? etc. And you should use this insight to perform better in the next test.

Instead of reading everything under the sun aimlessly, when you decode the mindset of UPSC and study the pattern of PYQ questions, you will be able to focus your efforts on more important topics and optimise your time.

It will make sure you don't forget or lose touch with a subject after you are done with it. For example, if you complete Indian Polity in April, when do you pick it up to revise again? We make sure every two months, you revise the basic concepts of the segments you have studied, without increasing your workload.
